George Rogers Clark National Historical Park - Vincennes, IN

The memorial at George Rogers Clark National Historical Park is believed to be the site of Fort Sackville. In February 1779, Lieutenant Colonel George Rogers Clark and his men captured Fort Sackville and British Lt. Governor Henry Hamilton. This victory over the British remains one of the greatest feats of the American Revolution.

Project Design Brief

In late 2011, the grounds around the statue of Francis Vigo, Financer for Clark's campaign, were refurbished with the addition of a trench drain to ensure the pedestrian walkways remained safe and dry during inclement weather.

Benefits

- KlassikDrain has a 0.5% slope inside the channel ensuring water flows to the outlets, ideal for flat pavement.
- ACO Type 479Q Mosaic grate matches the 1800's look and feel of the surrounding architecture.
